Katie has practiced as an occupational therapist in BC, including Vancouver General, Delta, UBC, and BC Children's Hospitals, and in Ontario, with Closing the Gap Health Care Group and Georgian Bay Family Health Team. Combining her work experience with her extensive volunteerism, Katie has expertise in trauma, reconstructive orthopedics, specialized eating disorders, cognitive behavioural therapy, spinal cord injury, and pediatric therapy, and she has demonstrated organizational skills in school-based programming, discharge planning, and developing assessment tools for use in clinical environments.
